Post: Clinical Psychologist - Counselor

What does a clinical psychologist do?

Clinical psychologists meet with clients to identify problems—emotional, mental and behavioural—in their lives. Through observation, interviews and tests, the psychologist will diagnose any existing or potential disorders. Then, together with the client, they formulate a program of treatment according to the client's needs. Psychologists monitor the client's progress on a regular basis to ensure that their needs are met by the course of action, and to adjust it if necessary.

Role of clinical psychologist:

- Identify psychological, emotional or behavioural issues
- Diagnose psychological, emotional or behavioural disorders
- Develop and implement treatment plans and therapeutic processes
- Help clients define goals and plan action to achieve personal, social, educational and vocational development and adjustment
- Monitor client progress through regular meetings or sessions
- Teach classes
- Conduct research
- Psychological Testing
